IB Unit of Inquiry Weather

We have started our new IB unit-**Sharing the Planet,** which looks at our science standards on weather. Our central idea for this unit is *Weather* patterns influence the ways we live.

This week we will be learning about meteorologists and the tools they use to tell weather. The children will be creating a weather station to keep both in the classroom and set up outside. Then they are going to learn about and then research extreme weather and write a weather report about one of the extreme weathers.

Starting next week, they will be rotating through weather centers. At these weather centers they will be learning about clouds, the water cycle, precipitation, floods/lightning, and predicting weather.

A couple of days during ELA, the children will be reading and researching about their chosen "extreme weather" and take notes to use on their weather report.

While the major of the work being done for this unit is in classroom work, we will be using google classroom. The classroom code for this unit is **xfhd101**. If your child has difficulty getting on their Google classroom at home please let me know.
