This Week's Learning

Fourth Grade ELA

Reading: We have finished "The Orphan of Ellis Island". Religion

For the next two weeks, we will be using the Nativity as our theme for Advent, as well as, our Advent Wreath. Adding different elements each day, reading from the bible, and discussing our progress towards Christmas.

IB unit of Study

We have started our new IB unit-Sharing the Planet. which looks at our science standards on weather. Our central idea for this unit is Weather patterns influence the ways we live.

Last week, during our İB time, we learned about meteorologists and different kinds of extreme weather. This week the children will be creating a weather station to keep both in the classroom and set up outside. They will then begin 6 weather centers. Each group will complete 1 center a day until all 6 are complete. At these weather centers they will be learning about clouds, the water cycle, precipitation, floods/lightening, and predicting weather.

A couple of days during ELA, the children will be reading and researching about their chosen "extreme weather" and take notes to use on their weather report.

While the majority of the work being done for this unit is in classroom work, we will be using google classroom. The classroom code for this unit is
