# IB Unit of Inquiry Weather

We are loving our new IB unit-**Sharing the Planet,** which looks at our science standards on weather. Our central idea for this unit is *Weather* patterns influence the ways we live.

Students have chosen an extreme type of weather to research and write a meteorology report about. They will be learning important research and note taking skills along with how to write a research report. Most of this work will be completed in class, however, some students may wish to find additional research materials from the library or internet research at home.

Last week we learned about the water cycle. On Friday, students working in groups came up with a plan to create a mini project to share their understanding of the water cycle. Each group has chosen how they want to present this to the class and will spend this week in class putting together their projects. Some of your children may come home and ask for supplies they may need to create their project. We will present them next week.
