This Week's Learning

Spelling: Spelling words will be passed out on Monday. The children should practice their words using the ideas on the Spelling Contract Sheet or the Spelling Jobs packet that is sent home. They can turn in homework for Class dojo points. Test is on Thursday, March 8th because of field trip on the 9th.

Reading: The children are continuing to read "Lunch Money" by Andrew Clements and completing vocabulary, comprehension, and other activities as they read. These are being collected in their Reading Journal.

Writing: We finished our extreme weather reports last week and will spend some time this week learning about different kinds of figurative language while reviewing similes and metaphors.

Grammar: We will continue to review and use prepositions and prepositional phrases.

Cursive: Each week the children will review letter form, slant, and size of their cursive letters. Next week, the children will be focusing on the letters Tt and Uu.

IB unit of Study

We are continuing our unit on Regions are formed based on shared Characteristics. Monday, the children will use a physical map of the United States and decide how they think the 5 regions are formed. We will be discussing if there are natural borders that separate the states and naming them as we go. The children will later be divided up into the 5 regions.
