This Week's Learning

Fourth Grade ELA

Spelling: Spelling words will be passed out on Monday. The children are required to complete the trace, copy, write to practice both their spelling and cursive. They still have a spelling job packet or contract. They can turn in homework for Class dojo points. Test is on Friday, June 1st. Same words for two weeks.

Reading: Book Club: We are continuing to read our different books written by Roald Dahl.

The children have been listening to book talk (and giving them) about some wonderful books that they have read. Each child must read 2 books from the library list of books by April. I have been reading them and giving a book talk about them so they can add them to their "Summer Reading List" Writing. We will begin drafting our fictional narratives. We are working to develop our characters and setting and to have an engaging beginning or lead.

Cursive: The children will be asked to complete more of their work in cursive. The daily work will be given a cursive grade as well as a grade for the assignment. Next week, they will be copying a poem in cursive as a test.

Central Idea: Animals and the places they live are not constant.
