WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

Math: Ms. Long's class only My Math_Chp. 1: Applying Addition & Subtraction Concepts, lessons 7 - 9 (Subtraction strategies - counting on number lines, 0 & "all" rules, & using doubles)

Language Arts/Reading: Ms. Long's class only Super Kids, Unit 1

Week 3 stories & skills focus on using words with -ng & -le sounds, building fluency with "short a" reading passages, identifying nouns and verbs, and using onomatopoeia

Writing: Unit 1 - writing an autobiography. This week, we'll be editing run-on sentences & writing in complete sentences

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Religion: Learning that God gave us free will so we can choose what is right & avoid what is evil. Practicing praying the "Our Father" and "Hail Mary"

Social Studies: Reading Scholastic News, "Second Grade Citizens" & discussing rights & responsibilities students have at school IB: Exploring how "Plants and animals work interdependently to create healthy ecosystems." This week, our guiding question is "Why do trees grow so tall?" Students will discover how important sunlight is to trees, & make original "grass heads" to demonstrate how plants grow
