Religion: In Chp. 8: The Holy Spirit Teaches Us, we learn to recognize the Holy Spirit as it guides us in an Examination of Conscience; celebrating Epiphany (on Jan. 6th) with Epiphany activities, king's cakes, & sharing blessings for the new year IB: Starting our Mystery Science unit which focuses on the idea that Inventions are dependent on available materials and human ingenuity. This week, students will explore answers to the question, "Why do we wear clothes?" They'll learn about the different properties of materials used for clothing, then will select materials needed to construct hats to protect them from the sun
