#### WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

Math: Ms. Long's class My Math Chp. 4: Subtracting 2-digit
Numbers lessons 1, 3, & 4; review of geometry skills, as well as
addition & subtraction facts

ELA/Reading: Ms. Long's Reading class Super Kids Unit 4 Week 3 stories & skills focus on spelling & reading words with "-old," "-ost," "-ild," "-ind;" skills include writing with suffixes "-ful" and "-less," as well using similes

Writing: Reading & understanding nonfiction features with Scholastic News article, "Malcolm Tackles Reading"
Religion: Ist Eucharist studies - Chp.2: Jesus Cares for Us focuses on how Jesus provides for us using John 6:1 - 15 (Jesus Feeding the Crowds); identifying 4 parts of the Mass

Second Step: Bullying Prevention lesson I helps kids learn to recognize bullying behaviors; home links will come home during the week, & are homework - please review & return them

IB: Continuing our Mystery Science unit & focusing on the idea that Inventions are dependent on available materials and human ingenuity. In week 4, students explore answers to the question, "Could you build a house out of paper?" Students look at how large structures, like houses, are built from smaller pieces, then design their own structures using paper
