#### WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

Math: Ms. Long's class My Math Chp. II: Measurement lessons I - 4 (measuring to the nearest inch, foot, & yard using rulers & measuring tape). Please help your child practice their Math facts at home every day; addition facts quiz on Fri. 3/22

Language Arts/Reading: <u>Super Kids</u> Unit 5 assessments; <u>Super Kids</u> Unit 6 week 1 stories & skills focus on spelling & reading words with "aw" sounds (spelled aw, au, augh, & ough), and writing with irregular past tense verbs

Writing: Identifying nonfiction features in <u>Scholastic News</u> article, "A Math Star" and learning about Katherine Johnson's love of math & work at NASA. Also using alliteration to write a creative poem about ice cream flavors

Religion: Ist Eucharist studies - Chp. 7: The Gift of the Eucharist focuses on Jesus gives us the Eucharist at the Last Supper (from Mark 14: 12 - 26), & how Jesus lives in us through this gift. We're also learning about St. Hyacinth, a model of reverence for God IB: Exploring central idea that "Being good stewards of the Earth is our right and responsibility." We'll explore the difference between (local) laws vs. rules in relation to taking care of the Earth. We'll also create our "Recycle/Trash" men to gauge how much trash/recycling we go through in a week at home
