- Math: <u>My Math</u> Chp. 1: Addition Concepts lessons 5 8 (Vertical Addition, Problem Solving, & Ways to Make 4, 5, 6, & 7); skip counting for 1, 5, 10, & 100 & writing numbers to 100 **ELA/Reading:** <u>Super Kids</u>, Unit 1 lessons 146 - 150 stories & skills focus on using words with -sh, -ch, & -tch sounds, identifying problem & solution, & writing with nouns & pronouns. <u>Scholastic</u> <u>News</u> nonfiction weekly article, "Apple Science," teaches about asking & investigating scientific questions <u>Writing:</u> Unit 1 focuses on narrative writing, writing sentences
- about past events and times they've felt happy, sad, mad, or scared, and adding details with words & pictures
- Religion: Continued work in Unit I: "God, Our Creator & Father." This week, we'll explore how God cares for us & ways we can show love.
