WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

Math: My Math Chp. 1: Addition Concepts, lessons 9 - 12 (Ways to Make 8, 9, & 10, & Find Missing Parts of 10); skip counting & place value review; MAP testing on 10/02

ELA/Reading: Super Kids, Unit 1 lessons 151 - 156 stories & skills focus on using words with -sh, -ch, & -tch sounds & writing with nouns & pronouns. Read unit 1 <u>Super Duper</u> non-fiction magazine, "Fix It," which teaches about fixing things in space. Read <u>Scholastic News</u> nonfiction weekly article, "Schools Long Ago & Today," which teaches about differences in schools in the past & present day, & reviews capitalization rules; MAP testing on 10/03

Religion: Continued work in Unit 1: "God, Our Creator & Father." This week, we'll explore how God cares for everything he made, including us, and study St. Francis of Assisi's example

IB (Social Studies): Working in our Who We Are IB unit with the central idea that "Families are unique." This week, we're reading books about unique family traditions and beliefs. Books include Lightning Comes in a Jar & The Keeping Quilt by Patricia Polacco. After reading, students will reflect on unique traditions they have in their families, and will create a "lightning jar" & "quilt" in class. *Note: Most work from these IB units will be kept here at school & put into your child's IB portfolio. These portfolios will be shared at conferences, & will come home with your child at the end of the school year
