WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

Math: My Math Chp. 5: Place Value lessons I - 3 (Numbers II - 19, count by 10s); review Fall topics for MAP testing

ELA/Reading: Super Kids, Unit 7 lessons 20I - 204 stories & skills focus on spelling words with long vowel + silent e sounds, marking long vowels, & teaching sequence with plot. Reading Scholastic News article, "A Hero's Story," to learn about Martin Luther King Jr.'s life & how he became a civil rights activist

Writing: Unit 7 focuses on opinion writing. Children will write opinions and give supporting reasons on a chosen topic Religion: In Unit 3 session II: Following Jesus, we'll learn about being good friends through Jesus & his apostles IB: Continuing in our HOW THE WORLD WORKS Mystery Science unit, "Patterns and cycles help people understand the Earth." This week, students will develop a mobile paper model of the sun's daily path across the sky, then use this model to help someone who's lost. They'll also read a book and learn that the sun stays up longer on some days than others. It also includes a short exercise where students get moving by acting out a bedtime routine.
