### WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

Math: My Math Chp. 4: Subtraction Strategies to 20, lessons 4 - 6 (Subtraction problem solving, make 10 to subtract, & use related facts to subtract)

ELA/Reading: Super Kids, Unit 5 lessons 194 - 196 stories & skills focus on spelling & writing words with long & short vowel sounds, identifying short & long vowels, & writing with dialogue Writing: Unit & focuses on informational writing. Children will finish researching information on their chosen topic, writing facts and drawing a diagram for their topics. Then they'll write a page on their topic, which will be collected into a class book Religion: During this 3rd Week of Advent, we'll focus on how we can bring & practice joy in the world; finishing discussions of Advent symbolism & the Church's liturgical calendar Second Step: Review of the 3 R's of Bullying Prevention -

recognize, report, & refuse bullying

IB: Wrapping up our HOW WE EXPRESS OURSELVES IB unit with the central idea that "Christmas is celebrated around the world." As our summative assessments, students are choosing a country (either one studied in class, or one they're interested in researching) & writing a mini report on their country's Christmas
