We are all getting the hang of our new procedures, routines and protocols to keep everyone safe and healthy in the classroom. We will spend the month of February learning about Black History. Please make sure to send in a special treat for your child to enjoy during the party and remind them it's for the party not to be eaten at lunch. In our homeroom google classroom, we have an assignment for Valentine Jamboards. Each student has their own board and all of their classmates will write a Valentine message for them. All of our remote students need to be sure and look at the changes on the times for our afternoon classes so you don't miss out on anything.

Now that we are back in the classroom, there has been some confusion with nightly homework. Homework is up on our <u>webpage</u> and also on our <u>Google site</u> for the week. Most days the homework is the same. Complete a spelling activity (or the Trace/Copy/Write page on Monday evenings), Moby Max fluency practice, and Reading nightly 15-20 minutes. However, after a math lesson we are ripping out the "My Homework" pages and sending them home for optional practice. Occasionally, we will have IB, Religion or Second Step homework. All of this will be on our webpage each week. If you or your child is unsure of their homework, you should check the webpage. If you cannot find it, let us know and we will be happy to help you.
