WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

Math (1st grade): My Math Chp. 6: 2-digit Addition & Subtraction lessons 1 - 4 (add 10s & 1s); take addition facts (0-10) quiz

Math (2nd grade): My Math Chp. 9: Data Analysis lessons 3 - 6 (bar & picture graphs); take addition facts (0-20) quiz

ELA/Reading: <u>Super Kids</u>, Unit 11 lessons 6 - 10 stories & skills focus on long-vowel "tricker" words & memory words; using end punctuation & capitalization. Reading <u>Scholastic News</u> article, "2 Cats' Habitats" to learn about & compare the habitats of lions & tigers

Writing: Unit II, using story evidence to answer questions about a text, comparing Superkids stories, & writing story/book reviews Religion: Preparing for Lent by learning Lenten symbols & traditions, & studying Mary, Mother of God, an example of obedience

Second Step: Lesson 16, "Managing Anger" we'll practice using Calming Down steps, like taking deep belly breaths, counting down, & using positive self-talk to manage anger & other big emotions

Social Studies (IB): Working on summative assessment "How families live around the world is shaped by their environment" IB unit. This

week students will select a country to study independently, then research how families in that country live, go to school, dress, shop, play, eat, etc. Students will use that research to start writing a country book report; students will present book reports next Thurs.
