Writing: Have your child keep a daily journal by responding to different writing prompts. I'll send home a Superkids journal and writing prompts (to cut and paste into their journal pages) with your child's end-of-year gift on Friday
Reading: READ, READ, READ! Summer reading is key to keeping your child's reading skills sharp and avoiding that "summer slide" so he/she starts 2nd grade strong! Find books at the local library or read books on Epic! for at least <u>30 minutes a</u> day, and have your child record their reading on their Summer Reading log. He/she can also practice Ist grade reading/ELA skills on Education.com

Science & Social Studies: Extend your child's learning of 1st grade concepts with some fun local field trips! Try the Pacific Science Center and Planetarium (patterns of the sun, stars, and moon), MoPOP (light and sound patterns), the Zoo or the Seattle Aquarium (plant and animal adaptations)
