This week is packed with exciting learning activities! Here's where we're headed this week in the classroom:

In **Writing** with Mrs.Smith: On Monday, students will start their Camp journals and continue writing while at Camp. Emphasis will be on incorporating some of the strategies students have learned in our Personal Narrative Unit: 1) Write in a way that allows readers to experience the moment with you; 2) Tell the story from <u>inside</u> it using internal thinking; and 3) Use details that are true to the event. Students may choose to develop one the ideas from their Camp journal if they finish their Personal Narrative story early. **There will be NO Grammar this week.** Please email me at **rsmith@stlukeshoreline.org** if there are any questions or concerns.

In **Science** we will learn that our entire world is a system of connected parts, with each part dependent on the other parts for its material nourishment. We will be participating in lots of hands-on learning this week and we will take lots of pictures to share when we return to school.

In **Religion** this week we will spend the week enjoying all of God's creation at Camp Seymour. There will be NO Second Step this week since we will be at Camp Seymour.

In **Math** *with Ms. Bakamis*, on Monday we will continue Unit 4: Adding & Subtracting Decimals. In this unit the students will learn how to use partial sums to add decimals, represent subtraction of decimals to the tenths & hundredths, use & explain strategies to add & subtract decimals. After each lesson, the students will work on a page of related questions. They'll also have a page of questions to work on at home. This practice will help them make meaning of the new skills & transfer them to their own lives. In **Math** *with Mr. Carson*, we completed our unit on percentages, decimals, and fractions. The test was provided Friday and will be completed on Monday. Carson Math will start a new unit when everybody returns from Camp Seymour! In **Reading & Spelling** with Ms. Bakamis, students are encouraged to bring a book to read at Camp Seymour.
