Dear Parents.

It is hard to believe that Easter is a week away. We have many wonderful activities planned to reflect during Holy Week. We started today with learning about Palm Sunday. And we will continue with The Triduum. On Good Friday, as a school, we will be prayerful and silent as we dismiss at noon to honor and reflect on Jesus's suffering and death.

We are finishing up our IB unit, Indigenous People Express their Culture based on the Resources available for them. It's now time for the children to express themselves using the natural resources around them. They need to take a walk and find things in nature to create and express themselves as the Indigenous people did. It can be a piece of art, craft, or something useful like a tool that an Indigenous person would have used for hunting, gathering or eating. We will be teaching on Tuesday the 26th.
