Dear Parents,

It's hard to believe that the month of September is over and we have been in school for 4 weeks already. We are starting to get in a groove with our schedules and homework. We have been talking about responsibility in our classes a lot. Students have more responsibilities to complete work in class, finish assignments at home if they do not finish in class, and complete their homework each night. (Remember they are welcome to complete the entire spelling job packet but only one activity a night is required with Monday being Trace, Copy, Write) We really put this responsibility on the students. It is very helpful to establish routines at home for homework just like we do in the classroom.

The food locker is empty so we have moved up our fall food drive to help our community. 3rd grade families are asked to send in jam, jelly, or honey (small or medium jars), cereal (especially Raisin Bran, Cheerios, etc, and oatmeal in single-serve flavors).
