Speech Team Requirements and Registration 2022-2023

As in many sports, Speech Team is an individual achievement and a group effort. Each member of the team is vital for every practice and for every tournament so that all of us can succeed this year. Therefore, a commitment from both students and parents or family is necessary off and on from September to December and hopefully through March too.

By joining the Speech Team, students agree to:

- Select at least one speech category
- Find and/or write material in the chosen category (except Impromptu)
- Love your speech and want to share it creatively
- Meet all deadlines, especially preparing for tournament dates
- Participate in at least one tournament
- Practice, practice, practice! 20-30 minutes at least two days per week should be the goal. (Literally every day is the best. Consistency is key)

For in-person tournaments:

- Provide double-spaced, typed (14-point font size recommended) copies of speeches, mounted on black paper
- Make a copy for you and one for the Coordinator
- Provide a folder or plastic cover for your speech

Speech Team parents or families agree to:

- Work with your student to help him/her choose a speech category
- Help with speech selection, including brainstorming, researching, and writing assistance to develop sections that meet the criteria of the speech category
- Help to balance school work, sports, and other activities with Speech Team practice at home and tournaments
- Help your student schedule practice times at home
- Help your student during practice time by listening, timing the speech, and always encouraging them
- Volunteering to judge at a tournament (We MUST have 1 judge for every 5 students!)

For in-person tournaments, we also ask that those who can:

- Bring snacks
- Bring water to share
- Help carpool with other Speech Team members

Meetings

You need to agree to come regularly to Speech Team meetings after school on **Thursdays 3:15pm-4:15pm.** Our first meeting is 9/28.

Please email the coordinator about any absences from practice. As this is a team effort, missing a meeting could affect what the team can accomplish.

Materials

Each Speech Team member is responsible for providing the following items for every practice and/or tournament, especially in-person events:

- Speech Folder
- Script of speech selection or written speech (typed properly and mounted)
- Pencil
- Appropriate dress for speech being given
- PPE Face covering (in-person tournaments only)

Volunteering

Each family of a Speech Team member is asked to volunteer to be a judge at one of the tournament dates. Training on being a judge will be provided. The tournaments traditionally are:

Archbishop Murphy (In-Person @ Murphy)	October 29, 2022
Bishop Blanchet Middle School Speech Tournament (TBA)	Mid December
Seattle Prep Speech Tournament (TBA)	Early January

Fees

Each tournament has a fee per participant and an entry fee in some cases. Although the school helps to defer these costs, we ask families to contribute \$25 as well.
