<u> Ways to Practice Your Spelling Words:</u>

- Write your words 5 times each.
- Write the list of words in alphabetical order.
- Write each word once using a fun color for the vowels and blue or black ink for the consonants. (You may print on this assignment since you are switching colors.)
- Type your spelling words. Use a different font and/or color for each one.
- Cut letters from old magazines, catalogs or newspapers. Glue them down to spell your words.
- Make a word search for your words. Be sure to highlight the answers! Ask your teacher for graph paper if you don't have any.
- If consonants = 1 and vowels = 2 find the value of each word.
- Make each word out of play-dough, toothpicks, or other household items.
- Use letter tiles from a game (or create your own) to spell each word.
- Write words as stair steps (as described in class by Ms. Bakamis)
- Write each word and then trace around each at least twice with crayon or marker (rainbow words)
- Create a comic strip using at least 7 of your spelling words
- Choose five spelling words you think are the most difficult. Make a learning aid to help you learn the spellings.
- Use graph paper to make at least 10 of your words connect.
- Write five alliterative sentences with your spelling words.
- Create a picture using your spelling words. You must include 10 of your spelling words and the picture must be colored.
- Write a story using 7 of your spelling words. Underline the spelling words in your story.
- Put your spelling words in backwards ABC order.
- Any other spelling practice that helps you learn your words and the pattern!
