Here's where we're headed this week in the classroom:

This week in **Reading & Spelling** with Ms. Bakamis, students will be encouraged to bring a book to read at Camp Seymour. They will be turning in another **Book Report due on October 31st, 2022** when they return from camp. This book should be something that they've finished in the month of October and should be within their current Lexile Level. It is also expected that they take an AR Quiz on this book. **Our first trimester AR goal is 15 points! There will be NO Spelling this week due to our Outdoor Environmental Education at Camp Seymour.**

In **Writing** *with Mr. Scholz*, we continue with our Grammar practice (online and interactive reference notebooks) as well as honing our Writing skills. In our Narrative Writing unit, we will continue revising and growing our "seed idea" story drafts. We are stretching ourselves as we rewrite these drafts to re-imagine the outline, use story arcs and answer the big question: what is this story *really* about!

This week in **Science** we will continue our unit on how organic matter cycles through our living world in systems of interdependent parts. Our lessons at Camp Seymour will focus on the ecosystems and the world around us. Each student will be encouraged to reflect on their experiences at camp in 3 journal entries.

In **Religion** this week we will continue our unit on God, Our Creator and Father. Students will be encouraged to look for God in the wonderful natural world around us at Camp Seymour. *There will be NO weekly Second Step lesson this week*.

This week in Math with Ms. Bakamis & Mr. Scholz, we will review our skills of Adding and Subtracting Decimals before we leave for camp. In Math with Mr. Carson, we have finished our second unit all about Percentages this week and will begin our review. Our test is on Monday, October 24th! Please accept the Google Classroom Invite! Our weekly ALEKS expectation will be that each student completes at least 5 topics by Sunday night.

In **Library** with Mrs. Feucht, we are approaching the end of our lessons on Digital Citizenship.
