This week in Grade L

Responding to student needs and various levels of mathematicians in grade 4, both fourth-grade math classes will continue to be differentiated daily. 3 days a week, all students participate in a mini-lesson based on a new strategy for the concept being explored. After the mini-lesson, students either work on reinforcement problems, practice problems to increase fluency, challenge their understanding with error analysis, STEM connections, or "Extend Your Thinking" problems. At least two days a week, all students work in small groups and receive direct instruction from a teacher at their current instructional level.

This week in math we will complete Unit 9: Addition and Subtraction Meanings with Fractions. The Unit 9 assessment will occur the day after the review this week.

Our new IB theme we will focus on now is Sharing the planet. We will continue to inquire into Washington State's landforms, natural resources, and weather to determine how this affects trade and the economy. Students will complete and present a specific region of Washington State and from their conducted research on 1 of the 5 regions of Washington.

In ELA, students will not have a spelling list this week. We will continue reading *Lunch Money*, chapters 15-16, emphasizing comparing and contrasting and determining the meaning of words and phrases. In writing, we will learn how to cite text as evidence in our essays. No grammar this week.
